New rates for next season

SSINVEST is considering several policy changes effecting the way in which Wawaitin Holiday Park and WildExodus prices its products and services. Approval is expected early in the new year and before the 2005 season begins and will result in a base increase of 10 - 12% for camping lots, 6 - 9% for packaged holidays, and 2% per year for long term leases. Please note that this is the first change to our rates and it is being driven primarily by increases to our taxes, electric consumption and rates.

Electricity

On our spring gazette of 2001 we asked for your assistance in keeping the cost of services to a maximum of 12% of your lease cost (<\$200.00/lot) and in the last issue informed you of a 14% increase per lot in electricity consumption from 2002 - 2003. Despite our best efforts in conserving so your lot fees don't change, we are expecting forthcoming data for the current year that will show even a larger increase. This will require that we pass on to you a portion of the bigger cost of servicing your lots. We will make this information available to you as soon as it has been compiled.
