Park Services



Water



. While the water to your lot's service stand is on, from May to October, it will be tested by a private certified laboratory twice monthly. As recommended in last year's water report, filtration has been discontinued; it was found to not contribute to the safety of the supply for drinking purposes. You will be promptly notified should we receive notice of any adverse test results. We continue to encourage you to purchase bottle drinking water for consumption while staying at your camps.

Sewage



The Park uses a conventional septic tank and bed system to treat and dispose of sewage and waste water produced at your trailer. Again last fall, when the system was cleaned and flushed before shutdown, very harmful materials were pulled out of the pumping station (cigarette filters, tubular female sanitary napkins, plastic medicine bottles, rocks, etc.). Please be careful not to dispose of anything into your drains which will not rot - if not sure, hold on to it and ask first!

Electricity



The terms of your lease states that appliances are not permitted outside your trailer. The tables below are for your information and reference. Table 1; from 1997 to 2006 (10 years) shows a doubling of costs to provide services to your lot. Table 2; lists today's cost of operating appliances typically installed in RVs and additional ones permitted. Table 3; lists additional equipment permitted with written consent and the costs for same which will not be prorated in any way. When consent is granted, the seasonal fee must be paid in full by June 1st.
